



- Goal 9. Continue to enrich Belmont's outdoor recreation opportunities with trail improvements, volunteer collaborations, and wayfinding features.







OPEN SPACE MANAGEMENT PLAN



OPEN SPACE MANAGEMENT PLAN

Plan consists of:

- 1. Environmental Assessment
- 2. Recreational Use Assessment
- 3. Base Plan
- 4. Management Alternatives

Methods included:

- Desktop research
- Site visits
- Community and stakeholder input



FINDINGS

Key Findings from Environmental Assessment, Recreation Use Assessment

- 1. Over 90 percent of the open space lands consist of native biological communities.
- 2. 11 special-status plant species and 7 special-status wildlife species have moderate/high potential to occur or are present.
- 3. Non-native species generally limited.
- 4. Trails represent about 1.3 percent of open space lands.
- 5. Approximately 50 stream crossings identified.
- 6. Less than 10% of trail erosion ratings were considered "high."
- 7. Rates of participation in nature-based recreation are increasing.

FINDINGS

Key Findings Wildfire Hazard AssessmentSteep topography, weather, and the potential to damage human life and structures

- Very high wildfire hazards for WDL
- High wildfire hazards for SJC




FINDINGS

Key Takeaways

- 1. Overall habitat quality is high.
- 2. Existing nature-based recreational uses can continue on existing mapped and established, previously unmapped trails.
- Continue wildfire fuel reduction efforts.


