	The heavy rains this week led to multiple mudslides and flooding, and it's quite obvious that the open space trails are dangerous in these wet conditions. Further, even bikers acknowledge that they should not be riding on muddy trails as it damages the surface and leads to channeling of water that further erodes trails. Yet by noon on Sunday - 12 hours after record rains and flooding - the bikers were back in number, entering the trail system at the Hallmark Parklet – an unauthorized entrance.	
	2 weeks ago I sent video of numerous bikers entering via this unauthorized trail and even falling on the steep and muddy surface. On Sunday Jan 1 – hours after flooding and landslides, I took this video and photo of a parent who dropped off a teen to ride alone, knowing the trails were flooded and in places simply gone. Many others entered throughout the day. The fact that the City posted trail closure at other sanctioned entrances only drove bikers (no hikers) to this unsanctioned entrance in larger numbers. The lack of clear policy and enforcement is damaging our trails and endangering the public. We are in for two more rain events this week. I strongly urge the City to adopt a clear and enforceable policy immediately and to close trails at ALL entrances including the unsanctioned ones.
